What is genre-fication?

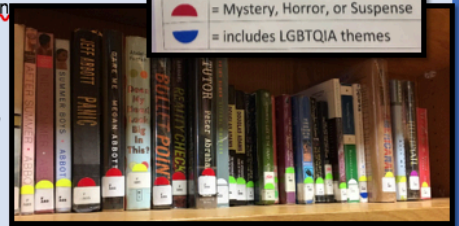
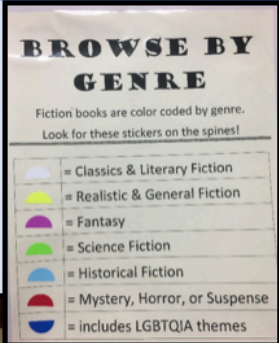
Classifying books according to a genre or subject.

Thinking of how people find books in bookstores or online, librarians are realizing that the Dewey Decimal System does not allow for easy browsing. Most people enjoy browsing according to the genre or subject they are interested in, and genre-fication makes that possible in a library setting.
